- Personal Appearance + Appointment
- Duly Accomplished Dual Citizenship Application Form
- Original and one (1) photocopy of the Birth Certificate or Report of Birth issued by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA)
(Get your PSA copy at psahelpline.ph or psaserbilis.com.ph)
- Original and one (1) photocopy of PH and Foreign Passports' data page
- Original and one (1) photocopy of Marriage Certificate(s) or Decree of Divorce if divorced or Death Certificate(s) of spouse(s), including previous marriages
- Original and one (1) photocopy of Naturalization Certificate issued by the foreign government
- Two (2) colored 2" x 2" photos taken within six months with white background
- Processing Fee (USD \$50.00) + (USD \$10.00 for consular outreach mission processing which includes same-day release)
(ONLY payable in [cash](#), [credit card](#), or [money order](#) made to the "Embassy of the Philippines". Personal checks are NOT accepted.)

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR DERIVATIVE CITIZENSHIP OF MINORS/CHILDREN*

- Two (2) colored 2" x 2" recent photos
- Birth Certificate
- Certificate of Naturalization/Citizenship
- PH and Foreign Passport
- Processing fee (USD \$25.00) for each minor derivative

You are eligible for dual citizenship under Republic Act 9225 if you were born Filipino, you were naturalized as a citizen of another country, and are at least 18 years old. Minors will be included in their parents' appointment for derivative citizenship. Book your appointment for dual application via our website: <https://philippineembassy-dc.org/appointments/>

If one of your parents was Filipino when you were born in the United States, you are already a dual citizen at birth. You only need to report your birth by mail to the Philippine Embassy/Consulate. Visit our website for more information.
