## REACQUISITION OF PHILIPPINE CITIZENSHIP

**CHECK YOUR ELIGIBILITY**: You are eligible to apply for this service if you: (1) were born Filipino; (2) became a naturalized citizen of another country; (3) are at least 18 years old; and (4) will personally appear at the Philippine Embassy in Washington DC. ☐ Original and one (1) photocopy of <b>foreign passport</b> data page, regardless of expiration date
☐ Original and one (1) photocopy of <b>document to support change of name</b> , if applicable Example: marriage certificate, divorce/annulment decree, spouse's death certificate, etc.
☐ Original and one (1) photocopy of <b>naturalization certificate</b> issued by the foreign government
☐ Two (2) colored <b>2" x 2" photos</b> with white background, taken within six months

☐ USD 50 <b>processing fee</b> (additional USD 10 for consular outreach processing)

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR DERIVATIVE CITIZENSHIP OF MINORS
☐ Original and one (1) photocopy of <b>birth certificate</b>
☐ Original and one (1) photocopy of <b>Philippine passport</b> data page
☐ Original and one (1) photocopy of <b>foreign passport</b> data page
☐ Two (2) colored 2" x 2" photos with white background, taken within six months
☐ USD 25 <b>processing fee</b> per minor

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- PLAN AHEAD. The Embassy has no photocopier/printer/stamps onsite, so prepare your documents ahead.
- **FILIPINO AT BIRTH?** If one of your parents was a Filipino citizen at the time of your birth (on or after 17 January 1973), you are a Filipino citizen at birth and are not eligible for this service. File your Report of Birth application with the Philippine Embassy/Consulate with jurisdiction over the place of your birth.
- FOR CONSULAR OUTREACH MISSIONS, dual citizenship applications must be mailed to the Embassy in advance to secure an appointment. Visit <a href="mailto:tinyurl.com/OutreachDC">tinyurl.com/OutreachDC</a> for outreach instructions.
- ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS. The consular officer reserves the right to require additional documents to prove identity and/or citizenship, and ensure accurate and complete personal data entries.
- PASSPORT INFORMATION. If you would like to apply for a passport on the same day of your oath taking ceremony, bring another set of photocopies of your documents and a USPS Priority Mail Flat Rate Envelope with USD 11.90 stamps. The name on your passport will follow the name on your PSA documents.
- YOUR NEXT STEPS. Get a certified true copy of your dual citizenship certificate. Report your marriage. Report your child's birth. Apply for your spouse's immigrant visa. Register as an overseas voter.
