IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- PLAN AHEAD. The Embassy has no photocopier/printer/stamps onsite, so prepare your documents ahead.
- **VALIDITY.** You have 30 days from the date of issuance to travel to the Philippines. Some countries do not accept emergency travel documents. Check with the embassy of the country you plan to transit through.
- **ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS.** The consular officer reserves the right to require additional documents to prove identity and/or citizenship, and ensure accurate and complete personal data entries.
- NEED PSA DOCUMENT? Order online at psaserbilis.com.ph to have it delivered to your address abroad.
- **UPON ARRIVAL IN THE PHILIPPINES**, you are expected to surrender the used travel document at any DFA consular office and apply for a new Philippine passport.
- THE EMBASSY ASSUMES NO RESPONSIBILITY for any delays or loss of documents during mail delivery, or while in the custody of the courier service.
